Lesson 27 Descriptive Words

2.L.6 — Low, 3.L.5.b — Low

Adjectives and adverbs are two kinds of descriptive words. Adjectives describe people, places, and things. Adverbs describe verbs, adjectives, or other adverbs. Using descriptive words in your writing can help readers understand what things were like or how things were done.

Example

Original: I took the cup off the shelf.

Descriptive: I carefully took the chipped cup off the dusty shelf. (The adjectives chipped and dusty and the adverb carefully make the sentence more specific.)

Many descriptive words give details that relate to five senses: sight, hearing, smell, taste, and touch.


Examples It was hard to see the street under the blazing sunshine. (sight)

The thumping music gave me a headache. (hearing)

The rich smell of coffee drew me toward the shop. (smell)

I couldn't wait to dig in to the tangy potato salad. (taste)

The paint on the shed was **brittle** and peeling off. (touch)
